The Six Sacred Rules of Divine Reporting

I Observe Without Interfering

The reporters are guests in history, not its authors. They watch what happened, faithfully and exactly as it happened, and they never try to change a story — even when their hearts ache to.

II Report Truth, Not Opinions

Facts come first. A reporter's feelings matter, but they belong in their own perspective, never disguised as fact. The Bible tells the truth even when the truth is hard, and so do the reporters.

III See With Love, Not Judgment

The reporters witness people at their worst. Judgment comes easy in the face of all that. Love is harder. They choose love, because that is how God sees the same people.

IV Work as a Team, Not Alone

Penny sees the heart. Hoot sees the context. Dominic sees the questions. Together they see more than any of them could alone. Pride says, "I have it." Wisdom says, "We have it."

V Respect the Story

The events recorded in Scripture are sacred. They belong to God, and to the people who lived them. The reporters never sensationalize, never embellish, and never use Scripture as a stage for their own talents.

VI Protect Free Will

God gave humans the freedom to choose, and the reporters never violate it — not even to save someone from a wrong choice. To override a person's choice, even for their own good, is to take something only God has the right to give.

THE SACRED OATH

We will observe what is, not what we wish.

We will report truth, not our pride.

We will see with love, not with judgment.

We will work as one, not as three.

We will respect every story we are given.
